- 1. Cyber bullying nearly doubled from 2007 to 2016 (18% of students to 34% of students).
- 2. In 2015, 24% of all middle school students were cyber bullied.
- 3. Being a cyber bully makes you 20 times more likely to become a victim of cyber bullying.
- 4. Less than one third of cyber bullying victims report it to their parents.
- 5. Cyber bullying can happen with texts, social media, email, and other electronic communications.
